



## Guidelines for Use of Knox-Lincoln County Beekeepers Extractors

One may borrow an available extractor if they are a member in good standing, with current year dues paid.

Check-out is for two days at a time.

The extractor is checked out clean and must be returned clean. If the extractor is returned dirty, the member will not be allowed to check out the extractor a second time. There will be a \$20 cleaning fee applied.

Directions for cleaning are included with the extractor and also shown below.

**PLEASE DO NOT REMOVE THE BASKET SO AS NOT TO LOSE THE BALL BEARING LOCATED  
IN THE BASE**

Each extractor set up includes:

- Extractor
- Uncapping Tub with cover
- Cold Uncapping knife
- Uncapping fork
- Stainless Double Sieve
- Honey Collection Pail [5 gal] with gate

# Guidelines for Cleaning KLCB Extractors

1. One must bring the extractor back CLEAN for the next person to use. To clean it:
    - a. First hose off thoroughly with COLD water to remove all honey, wax and propolis.
    - b. Then wash with hot water and soap, and rinse thoroughly.
    - c. Finally use a 3% bleach solution to sterilize all surfaces (1/2 cup bleach + 1 gallon water).
    - d. Rinse and drain thoroughly. Let stand to dry.
    - e. Please do not remove the basket so as not to lose the ball bearing located in the base.
- ⇒ If the extractor is returned dirty, the member will not be allowed to check out the extractor a second time. There will be a \$20 cleaning fee applied.

**ADDITIONAL NOTE FOR KLCB'S MAXANT SERIES 3100 EXTRACTOR:** This extractor is older. It is in good working order, but it is still a bit fragile. Watch out for sharp edges on the steel drum! Please bring it back undamaged!
